This report contains information that is required by the U.S. Department of Education (Ed).

Hamline's President, Fayneese Miller, signed and the University returned to Ed the Certification and Agreement document with the assurance that the University has and will expend awarded funds as designated to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

Subsequently, Hamline University received an award from Ed on April 22, 2020 in the amount of \$1,285,114 in accordance with the f nrxnl Mfb| y° bXS?ZjZ_SMI X" Vhl nk b'@ZV| xst° V{ (CARES) to provide emergency financial aid grants to students. These funds have been fully distributed to 1,360 students.

In addition, Hamline received a supplemental award from Ed on December 27, 2020 in the amount of \$1,285,114 in accordance with the f nrxnl Mfb| y?Zyuni yZ'MIX?ZjZ_ @ uujZk ZI {Ml° uuxnuxMbl y° V{ (CRRSAA) to provide additional emergency financial aid grants to students. These funds have been fully distributed to 852 students.

Finally, Hamline received a second supplemental award from Ed on May 19, 2021 in the amount of \$3,485,600 in accordance with the ° k ZxMI ?ZyM| Z'<jMI (ARP) to provide further emergency financial aid grants to students.

Therefore, Hamline University has received \$6,055,828 in total from Ed to provide emergency financial aid grants to students.

Regarding American Rescue Plan (ARP) funds, as of December 31, 2021, the last day of the fourth quarter, the total number of students at Hamline determined to meet the institution's standards for eligibility to receive an emergency financial aid grant was 3,139. In addition, as of that date, 1,287 current or former students have received emergency grants totalling \$2,181,376, an average of \$1,695 each.

This first group received a total of \$731,378. The second disbursement provided grants to 896 current domestic

undergraduate students with exceptional financial need based upon their AY2022 Pell grant eligibility, expected family contribution amount (EFC), and enrollment percentage, as shown in the table below.
